

Information about Corona in multiple languages

Many authorities and news outlets in Sweden are talking about Corona in several languages. Here are tips on what channels to follow.

Corona virus was an unknown virus for everyone. No one knew how it spread or how to protect themselves and each other. For residents who don't understand Swedish it has been extra difficult to get information about the Swedish strategies to mitigate a virus outbreak. But now different authorities, media, and organizations have developed information in several languages which they also update continuously.

The Swedish radio, Sveriges Radio (SR) report on Corona. Type <https://t.sr.se/2JR6DC0> in a web page on your mobile, tablet or computer, and choose your language.

You can also open your camera on your mobile phone and turn it toward (scan) the symbol (the QR code) and you will automatically reach the program.

The web page informationsverige.se is owned by Milsa which is a collaboration between Swedish universities and authorities, among others, and they are working to train community communicators (sambällsinformatörer). Here you can find films where community communicators provide up-to-date information. Right now there are films in Arabic, Somali, Persian and Tigrinyan, with more coming soon.

You can find information on your municipalities website. This includes many relevant links, to krisinformation.se and folkhalsomyndigheten.se, among others. There is information about Corona protection against the virus, local restrictions, and how Sweden is working to limit infections.



To access folhalsomyndigheten.se you can type in the web address or open the mobile camera and aim it at the QR code and reach it automatically.

On the Facebook page [Krissamverkan Kalmar län](https://www.facebook.com/Kalmarregionen) the information is mostly in Swedish, but sometimes in other languages. Here you can get information about how the regional authorities are working to manage the Corona crisis.
